Ten Tips for Getting More Out of Mass (continued)

4. Get Wet

Dipping your fingers into the holy water font when you enter and leave church can become just a habit, a routine that we perform automatically without giving it any thought. Make this profound gesture intentional. As you reach toward the font, thank God for the gift of your baptism, by which you became God's son or daughter and entered the life of faith. As you trace the Sign of the Cross on your body, contemplate how on the Cross Jesus suffered and died so that your sins can be forgiven. Consider how important it is to be filled with God's grace through the sacraments.

5. Sit Up

That is, sit up closer to the front. Why is it that people want front row seats at ballgames and concerts but prefer sitting in the back row at Mass? The closer you are to the sanctuary, the better view you will have to witness heaven visit earth through the power of the Holy Spirit. While you are at it, do not just closer to the front, but change seats frequently. Many Catholics seem to gravitate toward the same seats or same part of the church. Changing seats gives you a different perspective and may help you get to know other parishioners in your faith community.

6. Strike a Chord With God

While many Catholics may open the hymnal at Mass, too many take the word "refrain" literally - as in, they refrain from singing! If God gave you a beautiful voice, then praise him with it. If God gave you a terrible voice, sing anyway. Remember that singing at Mass lifts your voice, mind, and heart to your heavenly Father. St. Augustine said that when we sing, we pray twice. "Set the tone" for others by your example. The Mass, of course, is more than music, and many parishes could probably do a better job in this area. You may very well be able to help improve it by participating. If you sing well or play an instrument, consider joining the choir or the music ministry.

7. Get a Heart Transplant

Are you really placing your heart on the altar along with the gifts of bread and wine? Are you giving God permission to having his way with your life, entrusting him with your entire life now and your future? Do you pray like Christ on his knees in the Garden of Gethsemane, asking that the Father's will be done, or are you on of the disciples who falls asleep? At Mass, Jesus is offering you redemption, a time to exchange your tired, sin-tattered heart for his Sacred Heart. Take him up on his offer. Give God permission to transform your heart along with the gifts of bread and wine upon the altar through the power and work of the Holy Spirit.

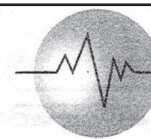
