WELCOME to Epiphany

Jesus challengers his followers to rise above their human tendencies

to judge others and recognize the truth of the spirit: that God calls us to see each other as children of God made in His image. Is your neighbor who spends Sunday morning sleeping in instead of attending church worthy of being judged by you? What about the homeless person you pass on the street, the opposing political party, the teenager who gets pregnant? There are so many examples of failures in our world which our human nature so easily judges.

But Jesus says when we are critical of others we are, in fact, ugly. The act of judging inherently strips another of their humanity. It removes the beautiful gift that a person has to act, think, and define themselves, and it substitutes a prefabricated identity in its place.

What's the opposite of judging? Understanding. When we humbly seek to understand another person, we acknowledge their experiences, their beliefs, and the pains and joys that make them who they are. When we seek to understand another person, we recognize our shared humanity. One of our heroes is Father Gregory Boyle, a Jesuit priest who works alongside current and former gang members in Los Angeles. He challenges people to seek "a compassion that can stand in awe at what [people] have to carry rather than stand in judgment at how they carry it."

Profiles In Stewardship

As we renew the call to Epiphany parishioners to be good stewards of their time, we recognize that, through the years, our parish has been blessed to have many parishioners who have answered that same call to service. In upcoming weeks, we will be shining a spotlight on certain of those disciples who have dedicated much of their time to Epiphany and its mission. Together with Joe Torre, Tom was very involved in the restoration of the current altar server program and has been active with the Events Committee. He has also served as a Eucharistic Minister. Tom's special ministry, though, has been his floral support of the parish, particularly on the altar on Christmas and Easter and through the delivery of flowers to our hospitalized parishioners, reminding them that they remain in the prayers of our community. Regardless of the activity though, for Tom, all things flow from the simple mandate. that "we all do our part to serve God."

looking to join a new parish. She soon realized that Epiphany was the place for her. The then pastor, Monsignor Walter, along with Fr. Nixon, immediately made her feel welcome and very much "at home". It didn't take long for Della to become part of the fabric of the parish. Very much a proponent of Divine Renovation, which emphasizes the missionary identity of a parish, she has been a Eucharistic Minister, bringing Communion to some of our homebound neighbors and a member of the Ladies of Charity. Together with Gloria Gannon, Ann Priolo and Therese Meany, Della was instrumental in forming the Parishioner Helping parishioners program, a group dedicated to helping some of our neighbors in need of assistance with their daily tasks. She is currently a member of the Pastoral Council and, during these Covid times, has been part of the Hospitality Ministry team, an unsung group that, for the past eighteen months, has cleaned the church and done the work so that their fellow parishioners have been able to come back to safely worship together.




